At its October 9-11, 2017 meeting, the Liaison Committee on Medical Education (LCME) reviewed the status report submitted on August 14, 2017 on behalf of the medical education program leading to the MD degree at the Marshall University Joan C. Edwards School of Medicine.

The status report addressed the program's performance in the following elements: Element 3.3 (diversity/pipeline programs and partnerships), Element 5.5 (resources for clinical instruction), Element 5.10 (resources used by transfer/visiting students), and Element 12.1 (financial aid/debt management counseling/student educational debt).

Based on the information provided, the LCME voted as follows:

### III. REQUIRED FOLLOW-UP

The LCME directed that the survey team conducting the next full survey carefully review the program's performance in the elements listed below. In addition to reviewing the elements as a whole, the team will focus on the following areas:

# Element 3.3 (diversity/pipeline programs and partnerships) – Satisfactory with a Need for Monitoring

- Number of offers made to applicants for faculty positions from the school-identified diversity categories and success in hiring applicants who represent those diversity categories
- Success in recruiting students from the school-identified diversity categories
- Activities and resources in place to support the school's diversity efforts

### Element 5.5 (resources for clinical instruction) – Satisfactory with a Need for Monitoring

- Adequacy of patient volume for clinical instruction in the required surgery clerkship
- Adequacy of faculty resources and didactics offered at the VA Medical Center
- The extent to which new clinical sites added within the last few years have improved clinical resources for students

# Element 5.10 (resources used by transfer/visiting students) – Satisfactory with a Need for Monitoring

• The impact on clinical resources for student education due to the school's arrangement with St. George's University of London

# Element 12.1 (financial aid/debt management counseling/student educational debt) – Satisfactory with a Need for Monitoring

- The amount of educational debt of medical students
- The efforts to enhance the availability of scholarships and the adequacy of scholarship funding to reduce student indebtedness

### CHANGES THAT REQUIRE NOTIFICATION TO THE LCME

The LCME awards accreditation to a medical education program based on a judgment that there exists an appropriate balance between student enrollment and the total resources of the institution, including faculty, facilities, and operating budget. If there are plans to significantly modify the educational program, or if there is to be a substantial change in either student enrollment or in the resources of the institution such that the balance becomes distorted, the LCME expects to receive advance notice of the proposed change. Substantial changes may lead

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the LCME to re-evaluate a program's accreditation status.
